Our Procurement Policy in KiwiRail provides the basis for sustainable procurement by actively embedding sustainability in our procurement activities to create positive impacts that will benefit the business, the environment, society, economy, and culture and get the best public value by making balanced decisions.

The programme adopts a comprehensive series of sustainability objectives to ensure the aspirations in its sustainability strategy are translated into measurable outcomes, helping to deliver broader outcomes and innovation across the project lifecycle. Contractors will have a critical role and ultimate responsibility for managing sustainability on these projects to achieve sustainability commitments and objectives.


Our sustainable procurement commitments will drive positive social, and economic outcomes, while providing a benefit to the environment. We will assess tenders across a range of sustainability and broader outcomes criteria contributing to 10% of the total assessment scoring. We will encourage our main contractors to:

- Procure low carbon materials and use recognized environmental labels
- Report on and reduce waste, energy, water, and emissions during construction

To meet the economic and social aspects, we encourage our main contractors to:

- Be a registered business with Amotai, Aotearoa's supplier diversity intermediary
- Employ workforce and businesses local to the programme in South Auckland and Drury for subcontracting

The DRS programme is committed to deliver sustainable outcomes through procurement, including the early works and main works of delivering the assets, and we will put in place the necessary tools, processes, and procedures to do so.
